Live Worthy of Christ (Part Two)

Philippians 1:27 - 2:4

Main Thought

Conduct yourselves in your behavior in a way that is consistent with your confession of Christ.

- I. Live as a citizen of the kingdom to which you belong (v. 27a).
 - > Being a citizen carries with it a level of privilege, duty, and responsibility.
- II. Live as citizens governed by the life and law of God.

Important Considerations on Unity

- > The citizen of heaven <u>displays</u> a godly life in the way they live.
- III. A citizen of heaven should live in a way that is consistent with the life they profess.
 - The word "worthy" (v. 27a) simply means comparable, or equal, or consistent. In other words, live in a way that <u>demonstrates</u> the life you <u>claim</u> to have.

Four practical features of this kind of conduct—the How to

- 1. True Christians will <u>Stand firm</u> (v. 27b). *Food for thought*: this the critical <u>core</u> of worthy conduct. This is where true unity starts.
 - a. Sound <u>doctrine</u> is at the core of worthy conduct and true Christian unity.
 - b. Godly behavior results in worthy conduct and strengthens Christian unity.
- 2. True Christians will have a <u>single-minded</u> focus (v. 27b). *More food for thought*: this oneness <u>displays</u> unity.
